


# Best of 2018: The Funk Forty Fives

One of our fave organ outfits is back with a seven that will surely get you moving in the right direction, and hopefully if it's here in the good old US of A, it's in the direction of your local polling station to vote. The Scone Cash Players, led by the unstoppable Adam Scone team up with Spasibo Records for a two sider that will move your hand (and feet) like Lonnie Smith. Getting funky as he wants to be, Scone goes from moody to down right dirty with the funk. Along with some superb back beats (read: open drum breaks) and

saxophone work, this is funky organ business at its best. The flip, "Algier's Connection", a slow chugging organ train with some serious guitar work, is a side that would make Booker T. and Donald Duck Dunn jump up and scream "Yeah"! A bit exotic, it has got the minerals if you know what we mean Turkish.

Spasibo, based out out Saint Petersburg Russia knows a thing or two about the funk. Their catalog has highlighted a myriad of solid funk outfits, released some hip hop goodness, and now continues on with some amuse bouche from SCP's upcoming sophomore effort Blast Furnace. Today's heat comes from a band you may not have heard of by name, but may recognize the sound, as it's made up of some of the best funky players around. Scone Cash Players, who are lead by veteran organ player Adam Scone (Sugarman 3) and have put out a few heaters on 45 in the past are back with a new record "Year Of The Rooster" on Flamingo Time and put out on Miami's Mango Hill Records. Featuring Ian Hendrickson-Smith (The Roots!, Sharon Jones and the Dap-Kings) on sax, Jason Joshua on guitar, Eddie Garcia on drums, and Jose Pena on percussion, this double sider of organ funk is well, funky as hell. "Year Of The Rooster" is an organ fueled jazz funk tornado that builds with Hendrickson-Smith's sax wailing and Scone's organ building up to a frenzy. This is definitely not a track for the wall flowers, it commands you to get up, get moving, and get involved, ya dig? Proper organ funk at its best. The flip, "Dos Phoenix Part 1 + 2" a mod-boogaloo classic hits hard and stays that way throughout. If you are a fan of organ jazz funk, Hammond sounds, or just like your funk peppered with organ throughout, this is the record for you. Two solid sides. Check out the music below:

Scone Cash Players are the group led by Adam Scone, whose Hammond Organ playing you may recognize from his work with Sharon Jones, Lee Fields, Naomi Shelton, and others. He writes, arranges, and produces all of the band's work himself, and he's been doing it for quite a while, with Scone Cash Players albums dating back a decade and music under his own name dating back even longer. He just released a new album, *Blast Furnace*, last week, and now he's getting in the holiday spirit, with the *Scone Cold Christmas* 7" due out November 30 via Flamingo Time/Mango Hill Records (pre-order).

The 7" features two songs, "My First Divorced Christmas (Santa Clause Got a Divorce)" with **Lee Taylor** on vocals and "They Say It's Christmas Time (Christmas Time In Brooklyn)" with **John Dokes** on vocals. They're both warm and soulful, with light sleighbell percussion, offering two very different takes on the holidays. You can stream the band's new album below too.
